Prior to this position, Neesen was a Douglas County Public Defender, an associate attorney in the law office of Bradford Coenen Ashford and Welch and a management trainee for the First National Bank of Omaha. The award was established this year for Frances M. Ryan, who served as a faculty member from 1973 to 1994. During her tenure at Creighton, she endeavored to increase the recruitment of qualified students of color to the School of Law. This award is given to a Creighton law graduate whose career exemplifies the high level of professional achievement Ryan expected of those to whom she entrusted her vision: pursuit of excellence in legal services to the community, volunteer service in the Latino community, outstanding member of the community, advancing the legal rights and dignity of low-income immigrants, inspirational mentor to Latino law students and contribution to diversity in the legal profession's employment of ethnic minorities.
