Interfaith Dialogue in the Shadow of 9/11

The Kripke Center is sponsoring a conference, "Interfaith Dialogue in the Shadow of 9/11," on Sunday, Sept. 10, from 1-6:30 p.m. in the Skutt Student Center, Mutual of Omaha Ballroom. Join four of the country's leading scholars and practitioners of interfaith dialogue to explore what is meant by interfaith dialogue, why it is needed and what challenges and opportunities exist five years after Sept. 11. Speakers include: Rabbi Gary Bretton-Granatoor, Anti-Defamation League (A Jewish Perspective); Dr. Philip Cunningham, Boston College (A Christian Perspective); Dr. Sulayman Nyang, Howard University (A Muslim Perspective); and Rev. Dirk Ficca, Council for a Parliament of the World's Religions (Creating and Implementing Dialogue: Challenges and Opportunities). Registration is \$15 per participant. Women Smokers Needed

The Osteoporosis Research Center at Creighton University is looking for women who smoke at least a half of a pack of cigarettes a day to participate in a genetic study. The study is looking at the effect smoking has on bone health. This study involves no medication and is not a stop smoking study. If you qualify you will receive a bone density test at no cost to you. This bone density test will provide you with information related to your own bone health. This study involves two visits to the center and a stipend is available to those who qualify. To qualify you must: be Caucasian; be age 40-45 and premenopausal; not have taken hormones in the last year (including birth control medications); not have taken osteoporosis medication in the last year; not currently on any cholesterol medication; not have taken steroid medication in the last six months; not have taken seizure medications in the last six months; and currently in good health.
