My dear Jim;

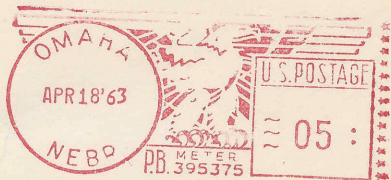
I've surely enjoyed your
