CREIGHTON UNIVERSITY WILL join hundreds of colleges across the country in the first National Eating Disorders Screening Program during Eating Disorder Awareness Week. Information sessions and screenings will be held in the Skutt Student Center Ballroom on Tuesday, Feb. 6. The sessions will be repeated at three different times: 10:30 a.m., 11:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. The program provides those who attend the opportunity to hear an educational presentation on eating disorders, complete a short, anonymous screening questionnaire, and meet one-on-one with a health care professional. Those who show symptoms of an eating disorder will be encouraged to make an appointment for a full evaluation. All screenings are free and anonymous. Individuals concerned about themselves, a roommate or a friend are encouraged to attend. This program is sponsored by Counseling and Psychological Services, Student Health, and Peer Education.
