### Professional Notes:

**Dr. Thomas R. Baechle**, professor and chair of the exercise science department, recently made a presentation at Offutt Air Force Base on "Career Opportunities and Credentialing in the Fitness Profession."

**Dr. Anthony Bull**, assistant professor of exercise science, is co-author on a research article accepted for publication in the European Journal of Applied Physiology. The article title is "The relationships among peak torque, mean power output, mechanomyography, and electromyography in males and females during maximal eccentric isokinetic muscle actions."

**Creighton Begins Chartrand Lecture Series:** Creighton University has established the Dr. Stephen A. Chartrand Memorial Lecture, the first of which will be held at 8 a.m. Sept. 28 in the auditorium at Children's Hospital. Pediatric infectious disease expert George W. McCracken Jr., M.D., professor of pediatrics at the

University of Texas Southwest Medical Center in Dallas, will discuss "Management and Control of Pneumococcal Infections in Infants and Children." The lecture is named after Stephen A. Chartrand, M.D., who served as chair of the Department of Pediatrics until his death in April from a rare blood disorder. To recognize his outstanding service to Creighton and to Children's Hospital; his contributions to research and medical training; and his friendship to many in the community; the University established the Dr. Stephen A.
