The World Herald refused to give us any publicity, on Coke on the grounds that it was against their policy to attack an individual organization. Denny

Holland and Harold Tibbs reported on a meeting they had with the Joint Council of the UPWA #11.

They agreed to stop handling Coke and to educate the rank and file members not to buy Coke until the policy changed. Taylor of the Urban League talked to Gothard today and reported that two people were to be hired at \$50.00 per week at semi-skilled labor. The DP club will make no decisions regarding this until the people are actually working there.

Mr. Morgan of Kappa Alpha Psi offered us \$7.50 for 1000 Coke leaflets. It was reported that we were under consideration for a donation from the CIO.
