AD ASTRA, a program for gifted and talented students ready to enter 7th, 8th and 9th grades in the fall, will be held during three sessions — June 11-17, June 18-24 and June 25-July 1 — this summer on the Creighton campus. Ad Astra offers gifted youth an introduction to areas of human activity and concern not usually encountered in the schools. It is designed to coordinate a challenging academic program with varied contemporary cultural activities and active social interchange in a week of living and learning on Creighton's campus. Students will take three of eight mini-courses whose topics include "The Many Faces of Sculpture," "What Makes a Poem Sublime?," "Fun With Physics," and "Relationship—Describe and Predict It With
