Priority seating is being arranged for parents and close family members of graduates attending Creighton's commencement, Saturday, Dec. 14, at Joslyn Art Museum. The priority seating, which was introduced with success in 1995, is considered a necessity because Joslyn's recent renovation and extension of the stage eliminated nearly 200 seats.

To assure that immediate family members receive priority seating, each graduate will be provided five priority seating tickets for Witherspoon Concert Hall. Graduates will receive their tickets when they obtain their academic robes on Friday, Dec. 13, between 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. in the V.J. and Angela Skutt Student Center. Potential graduates and their parents have been notified of the priority seating arrangements.

Commencement day begins with baccalaureate at 9 a.m. at St. John's Church.
