- vigil, -is** [vigeō 'be lively'], adj., alert, awake, on the watch.
Subst. m., guard
- vigilantia, -ae** [vigilāns (vigilō)], wakefulness, watchfulness
- vigilō, 1, -āvī, -ātum** [vigil], keep awake, watch, be on guard
- vigintī, num. adj.**, twenty
- vilis, -e, cheap, common, base, vile**
- vinciō, 4, vīnxi, vinctum, bind**
- vincō, 3, vīcī, victum, overcome, defeat, conquer**
- vindicō, 1, -āvī, -ātum** [vindex 'defender'], claim, ask judgment for, defend, deliver, avenge
- vīnum, -ī** [cp. vītis], wine
- violentia, -ae** [violentus], violence
- violentus, -a, -um** [vīs], forcible, violent, vehement
- vir, virī, man**
- virgō, -inis, f., maiden, girl, virgin**
- virtūs, -ūtis** [vir], f., manhood, manliness, courage, bravery, goodness, virtue
- vīs, vim, vī** (gen. and dat. very rare), f., force, strength, power, might, vigor, quantity, number
- vīta, -ae** [vīvō], life
- vītis, -is** [vieō 'bind,' 'plait'], f., vine, grape-vine, vine-branch
- vitium, -ī** [do.] (twist), defect, blemish, fault, vice
- vitō, 1, -āvī, -ātum** [do. (?)], turn away from, shun, avoid
- vitulus, -ī** [perhaps vetus] (yearling), calf, bull-calf
- vituperō, 1, -āvī, -ātum** [from adj. containing vitium, parō 'prepare'], represent as defective, disparage, censure, blame
- vīvō, 3, vīxī, victum, live, be alive, support life**
- vīvus, -a, -um** [cp. vīvō], living, alive
- vix, adv., with difficulty, hardly, scarcely**
- vocābulum, -ī** [vocō], name, noun, word (by itself, and without context)
- vocō, 1, -āvī, -ātum** [cp. vōx], call, summon, name
- volitō, 1, -āvī, -ātum** [volō, -āre 'fly,' freq.], fly about, flutter, flit
- volō, velle, voluī, will, be willing, wish, purpose, mean** (esp. with sibi)
- voluntās, -ātis** [volō], f., will, wish, desire
- voluptās, -ātis** [volup 'willingly' (volō)], f., pleasure, enjoyment
- volvō, 3, volvi, volūtum, roll** (trans.), turn around, revolve
- vorō, 1, -āvī, -ātum, eat greedily, swallow whole, devour**
- vōx, vōcis** [cp. vocō], f., voice, word, saying
- vulgus, -ī, n., folk, people, common people.** Abl. as adv. **vulgō, among** (or before) the crowd, commonly, generally
- vulpēcula, -ae** [vulpēs, dim.], little fox, Reynard
- vulpēs, -is, f., fox**
- vultus, -ūs, expression, look, face**
- Zephyrus, -ī** [Greek], west wind, zephyr
