Methods of Attracting Trade.

One Boston druggist gives three 2c stamps for a nickel. An enterprising German has patented a device for fitting phonographs to doors. As the customer enters the door of a shop, a voice will call out, "New consignment of a special quality sachet powder just received, try some," and similar invitations.

In a window display of rubber goods a sign that caught the eye ran: "Don't.....around looking for any better line of rubber goods than we are showing; you won't find them." A piece of rubber, fastened to the placard after the first word, gave forceful emphasis to the advice.

A printed placard hanging in the window of a Worcester drug store, an advertisement for a patent medicine, attracts attention. It states that this particular medicine is guaranteed to cure all the ills that suffering humanity is heir to, and the last line is, "It makes you cough up 25 cents.

One enterprising pharmacist who has returned to sheet wrapping paper has printed in light faced type on one side of each sheet of each size of the paper an advertisement of some one of his specialties. This paper is always manipulated with the advertisement inside. The druggist contends that his patrons do not wish to carry bundles with printing in sight. As he uses it, the majority of purchasers are unaware of the existence of the printing until the package is unwrapped, and then its unexpected appearance prompts them to read and remember.

A clever idea seen in one window was a number of miniature telegraph poles with five or six wires strung on the arms. A sign "Live Wires," was placed at one end and a placard was suspended from each wire advertising some specialty. Other similar blanks with announcements were pasted inside the window glass. This idea gave a chance for a bright play upon words, as, for instance: "Live bargains in all our lines," "You'll get a shock when you see the prices at which we have marked some of our goods."

Frequently a druggist may place advertising in street cars to his own advantage. He may not know what to say about his store in general, about prescriptions, etc., consequently if he will just shift his own preparations for a little while, one at a time, he will find his trade gradually increasing. He should never forget the fact that every time he advertises his own line of goods, he is doing a lot of indirect good to his general store.

Sometimes a druggist's newspaper advertising gets stale. He can't seem to get anything of any interest in his paper. There seems to be nothing to say about his store. The right man, of course, could say a lot of things about his goods and about his store, but somehow the druggist himself seems to "fall down on" his copy; he can't get up anything he likes. At such a time he should stop advertising his general store, and begin advertising his own preparations or his own goods. He should push them hard in the newspapers. That advertises his store and it creates an asset for him, because his own preparations cannot be taken away from him. His lotion for chapped hands and rough skin is sold as long as he is in business. Manufactured lotions may come and go; his competitors may cut the price on the manufactured articles so that there is no profit in them, and he may have to sell them at the cut price or not at all; but, his own lotion, if it is the right kind of lotion, under the right label, will keep on selling, and the trade in it keep on growing steadily; and that trade cannot be taken away from him. He owns it; he controls it. If he keeps on working up his preparations in that way, he does not have to worry about the general conditions. His customers will belong to his store and to him—Practical Druggist.

What Your Fingers Are Worth.

You have only to grasp a pen or a tool of some sort, says Tit Bits, to realize that the different fingers are far from having the same value with forming work. Much the most important is the thumb, for without it prehension would be very imperfect. The hand is no longer pincers, but merely a claw, when deprived of the thumb. It may be estimated that the thumb represents fully a third of the total value of the hand. The total loss of the thumb is estimated by competent authorities as 15 to 35 per cent for the right hand and 10 to 15 per cent for the left hand, except for workers in art, when 40 to 50 per cent for the right and 25 to 40 per cent for the left hand comes nearer the value.

The total loss of the index finger causes an incapacity estimated at from 10 to 25 per cent for the right hand and 10 to 15 per cent for the left. The middle finger is less important than the index. The ring finger is least important, and the little finger may be compared to its neighbor except in the professions in which it serves as a point of support for the hand.—Montreal Pharmaceutical Journal.

DECISION 94—MUST LABEL MINERAL WATER.

Manufacturers Must Tell Whether Their Product is Artificial, Imitation or Natural.

Under Food Inspection Decision No. 94, just issued, hereafter manufacturers and mineral water dealers are to label their product as artificial, imitation or natural. The new regulations provide that no water shall be labelled as a natural water unless it shall be the same as its source without additions or abstractions of any substance or substances.

The regulations also provide that no water shall be labelled as “medical water,” unless it contains one or more constituents in sufficient amount to have a therapeutic effect, and no water is to be named after a single constituent unless it contains such constituent in sufficient amounts to have a therapeutic effect when a reasonable amount of the water is consumed.

Hereafter it will be considered a violation of the pure food law if the label on a bottle of manufactured water bears any design or device, such as pictures of springs or fountains, which might lead the consumer to believe that the water was natural. Manufactured water may be named after a natural water in case the word “imitation” or “artificial” is also used.

Unrepeatable.

NEW RULING REGARDING “NEAR BEER.”

If Brewers Manufacture It They Must Pay the Tax Required for Manufactured Fermented Liquor.

Under the date of May 10, International Revenue Commissioner Capers has issued Treasury Decision 1360, dealing further with the manufacture on brewery premises of soft drinks and beverages containing less than one-half of one per cent of alcohol. He reiterates his previous ruling, refusing to approve the manufacture of “temperance beer” on brewery premises. While brewers can manufacture “temperance beer” at their breweries, they can only do so by paying the tax necessary for the manufacture of a fermented liquor. The decision says:

“It is held that the manufacture of an ordinary beer, and the reduction of the alcoholic content to less than one-half of 1 per cent by boiling in the open air, or by any other process, is prohibited unless the product is brought within the exemption of the proviso by being tax paid as a fermented liquor, regardless of its alcoholic content, but such product, containing less than one-half of 1 per cent of alcohol may be sold by retailers without the payment of special tax.

“Brewers who manufacture a beverage by this process should treat it in all respects as a fermented liquor, taking up on their records the material from which it is made.

“Brewers who also manufacture a beverage which does not at any process of manufacture contain more than one-half of 1 per cent of alcohol should credit themselves, by separate red-ink entries, on their material book with the quantity of materials used for this specific purpose; and should use the utmost care to keep the process as well as the materials used in the production of the two classes of beverages separate, and to keep the taxable and untaxable articles separate and distinct one from the other. The temperance beverage when removed from the brewery premises must be contained in packages unlike those ordinarily used for containing fermented liquor.—Pharmaceutical Era.

Hot Egg Consomme.

Pour a small amount of extract of beef into a 10-ounce glass and add an ounce of sweet cream; into the mixture break an egg, adding a little celery salt and spices, if desired; shake thoroughly and strain into a clean glass; add a small quantity of butter and fill with boiling water.—Soda Fountain.

Useful Points About Olive Oil.



As the demand for pure olive oil is increasing from year to year, it will pay the pharmacist to make it a special study. A pharmacist often thinks he is selling a pure article when he isn't, even though he may have tested it. He cannot rely solely on tests, as present-day adulterations do not consist in the addition of a single cheaper oil, but of ingeniously prepared mixtures of different oils in such proportions that on analysis it becomes difficult or impossible to distinguish the adulterated from the genuine oil. The chief adulterants are benne, peanut, and cottonseed; of these, benne is easily recognized. For peanut oil there is as yet no reliable color reaction.

The best tests known are the three old reliable Italian tests, namely, looking at the product, smelling it and tasting it. Secure a sample of absolutely pure oil to practice on. This will enable you to familiarize yourself with the color, odor, and taste of the pure article, and after becoming perfectly familiar with these characteristics you will have little or no trouble in identifying a pure oil. The U. S. P. does not describe a pure olive oil, as a pure olive oil

has a clear light amber color, without any trace of green; it is odorless, excepting a pleasant smell which accompanies all pure olive oils, and it has a fragrant, soothing taste.

Olive oil is the most difficult of all fixed oils to test, and a description of one or two tests for principal adulterants might prove of interest.

Five c. c. of the oil, placed in a stoppered bottle with 5 c. c. of amyl alcohol and 5 c. c. of one per cent solution of sulphur in carbon disulphide, and heated for an hour in a boiling saturated solution of sodium chloride, should develop no reddish tinge, which shows the absence of cottonseed oil.

Ten c. c. of the oil, when shaken with 10 c. c. of a freshly prepared solution of pyrogallol (2 gm. in 30 gm.) in hydrochloric acid, and the separated acid liquid heated in a water bath for ten minutes, should produce no distinct violet color, which shows the absence of sesame oil. * * *

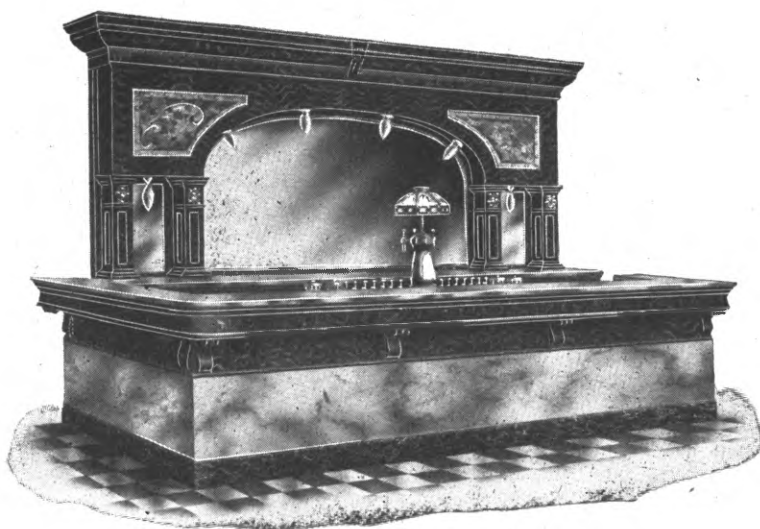

New Postal Rule as to Liquids, Etc., in the Mails.

The following order of the postmaster general modifies the existing postal regulation, and it is suggested that druggists and others desiring to send such articles by mail cut this out and post it for ready reference:

"Washington, May 2, 1908.—Order No. 1336.—Paragraph 2a of section 496, postal laws and regulations, edition 1902, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"When in glass bottles, such bottles must be very strong and must be enclosed in a metal, wooden or papier-mache block or tube, and there must be provided between the bottle and the block or tube a cushion of cotton, felt or other absorbent. The block or tube must be of sufficient strength to resist rough handling and support the weight of the mails piled in bags. If of wood, it must be at least 3-16 of an inch thick in its thinnest part; if of papiermache, it must be at least 5-32 of an inch thick for bottles holding from two to four ounces, and at least an eighth of an inch thick for bottles holding two ounces or less. The block or tube must be rendered water tight by an application of paraffine or other suitable substance, so that if the bottle be broken in transit the liquid will not escape or the tube become softened and allow the broken glass to be scattered in the mails."

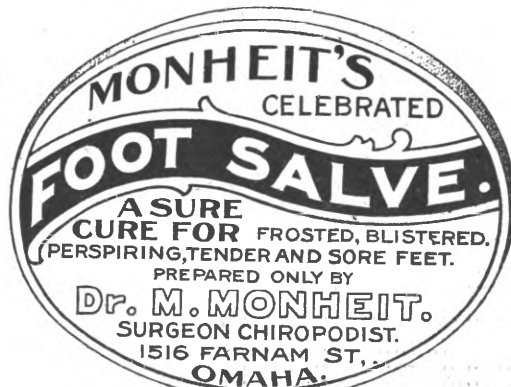
