The Creighton Cardiac Center is recruiting Type 2 diabetic patients for a study. Patients eligible for the study will be placed on the antihypertensive drug Atacand to be taken once daily. The study will run from four to 26 weeks and eligible patients will have an EKG, blood draw and endothelial function evaluations. The drug will be provided at no charge and patients will be compensated for their time and participation with a stipend of up to \$100 if the entire study is completed.
