O'Keefe**, assistant professor of theology, published an article, "Christianizing Malachi: Fifth-Century Insights from Cyril of Alexandria," in the most recent issue of *Vigiliae Christianae*. ■ **Dr. Eileen Wirth**, assistant professor of journalism and mass communication, has published an article, "The Impact of State Shield Laws

on Investigative Reporting," in *The Newspaper Research Journal*.
