Doors open at 7 p.m. and the performance starts at 7:30 p.m. "MANYA" is a one woman production that focuses on the life, accomplishments and struggles of Marie Curie. Many, as she was called, was a Polish scientist, mother and teacher. In the program, Curie's story is told from "the political oppression of her childhood, to scientific realization and fame, to the tragedy that forced her into single motherhood as well as further world prominence." Curie was the discoverer of radium and radioactivity. She also was the first woman in Europe to earn a doctorate in the sciences, the first woman to lecture at the Sorbonne and was the winner of two Nobel prizes (her daughter also won a Nobel prize). Creighton University Medical Center plans to unveil a revolutionary new diagnostic X-ray system by demonstrating its capabilities during a presentation today at 10 a.m. in the hospital's Trauma Center. The second hospital in the United States to install the Lodox Statscan, CUMC will be the only academic medical center west of the Mississippi to offer this new technology for rapid diagnostic assessments of injured patients. The device is capable of providing medical staff a full-body image within 13 seconds, resulting in rapid diagnosis and treatment.
