## MARKOE-DEPORRES SOCIAL JUSTICE LECTURE:

Dr. Jacqueline Pope, associate professor of political science at Richard Stockton College of New Jersey, will deliver the Third Annual Markoe-DePorres Social Justice Lecture on Thursday, Oct. 24, in the Walsh Lecture Hall. The 7:30 p.m. lecture is sponsored by the Justice and Peace Studies Program and will be followed by a reception. Dr. Pope's presentation will be "Too much month left at the end of the money: U.S. Social Policy in the '90s." A former welfare recipient, welfare rights activist, and scholar, she brings a unique perspective to questions regarding welfare reform. Dr. Pope chaired a panel on "Gender, Race and Multiculturalism in Academe" at the 1995 NGO Conference in Beijing.
