Chuck Header moved that the original motion be amended to read that we open up for three months with a \$90.00 payment in advance. Tom Walsh seconded motion. Carried. Bill Reid moved that the amendment to the original motion be amended to read that we open with no time limit. Mary Clave hauled seconded motion carried.

Discussion followed as to what rental price

should be offered to the proprietor. It was finally decided that \$40.00 a month would be the offer.
