Albert A. Agresti, S.J., professor of psychology and dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, made two presentations last weekend at the annual meeting of the American Psychological Association in Boston, and was the invited chair for a session on Religion and Clinical Practice. The first research presentation was a poster titled: Psychologists' perceptions of clients who claim therapist sexual abuse. The second presentation was a research paper titled: Availability of religious diversity training among APPIC internship sites.

Parking: On Aug. 30 construction of the Center for Health Policy and Ethics building will begin.

Parking in Lot #78 south of the ROTC/Varsity Press building and the southwest corner of Lot #68 will be prohibited. The area will be barricaded on Aug. 29 and a fence will be installed on Aug. 30. Additional parking is being constructed between 23rd and 24th streets. Faculty and staff parking will be authorized in Lot #68 east of the construction site.

A research study for an anti-viral drug for the common cold to help prevent ear infections is being conducted by Creighton Pediatric Infectious Diseases. Children ages 1 to 7 years are needed for participation in this study. The child must have had an episode of one ear infection following a cold in the last year. Enroll in the first 24 hours after the cold begins. Five study visits in 14 days are required with a stipend of \$50 per visit. Two blood draws will be taken during the study. If you are interested, call x4448 to see if your child qualifies for this study.

Architectural Exhibit in Lied Art Gallery: The Creighton Lied Art Gallery in the Lied Education Center for the Arts presents Midwestern Architects 3 through Sept. 17. This exhibition presents the architectural drawings, models and photographs of three national award-winning projects produced by three Midwestern architectural firms. The three firms featured are Randy Brown Architects of Omaha, Elliot + Associates of Oklahoma City and Herbert Lewis Kruse Blunck of Des Moines. Tom Prinz of Randy Brown Architects is the curator of this traveling exhibit. The Art Gallery is open daily from noon to 4 p.m. and is free of charge.

Laboratory Safety Reminder: Chemicals should be stored only in well ventilated areas. Storage should be below shoulder height, with strong acids and caustics stored only on the lowest shelf, approximately at floor level. Incompatible groups of chemicals must be kept separated. Storage shelving should preferably have a raised front edge (1/2- to 1-inch). Flammables, other than very small amounts, must be stored in approved storage cabinets. Chemicals should never be stored in closets or intermixed with combustible materials (e.g. paper, boxes, etc.).
