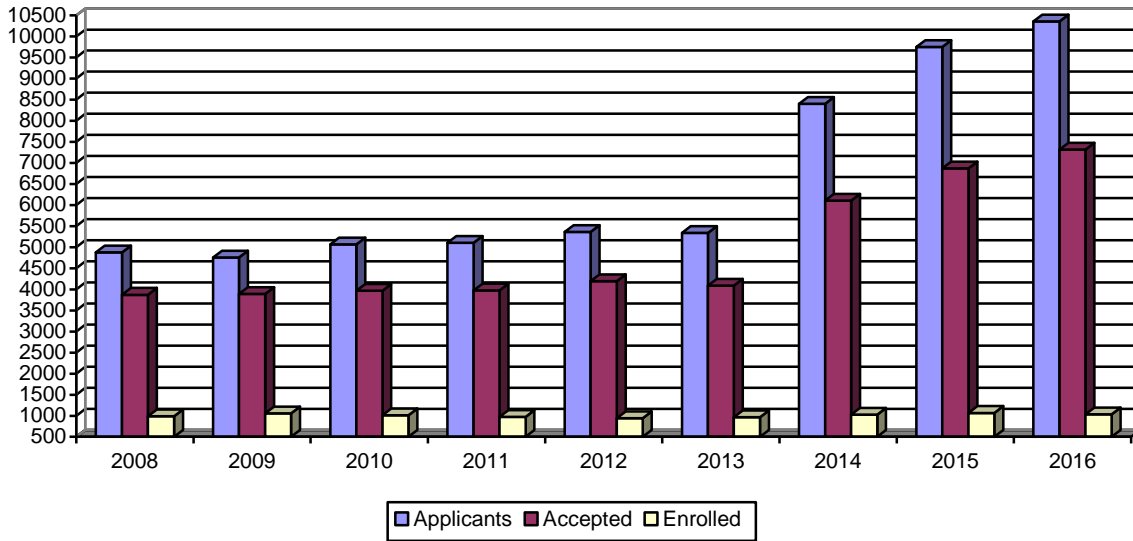

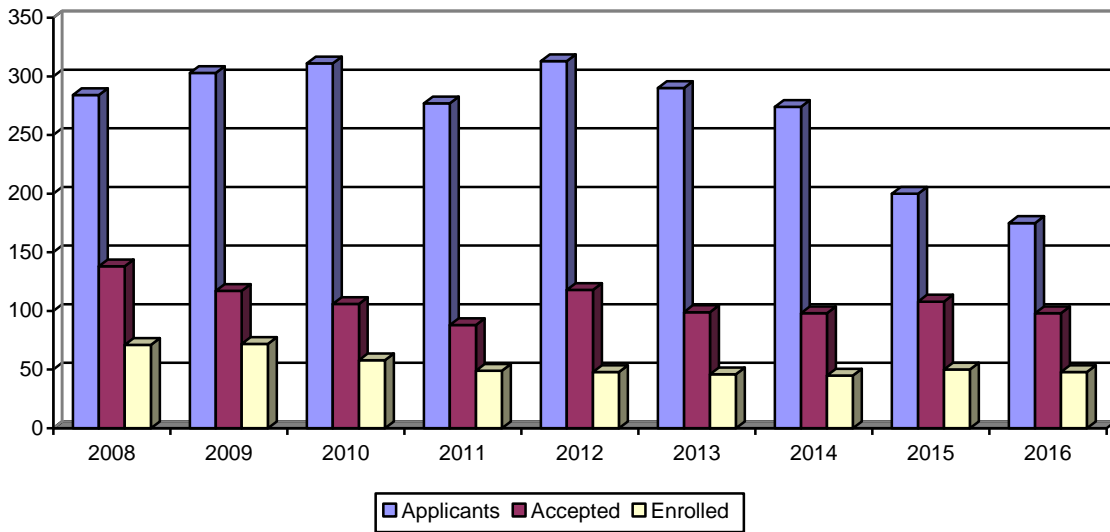

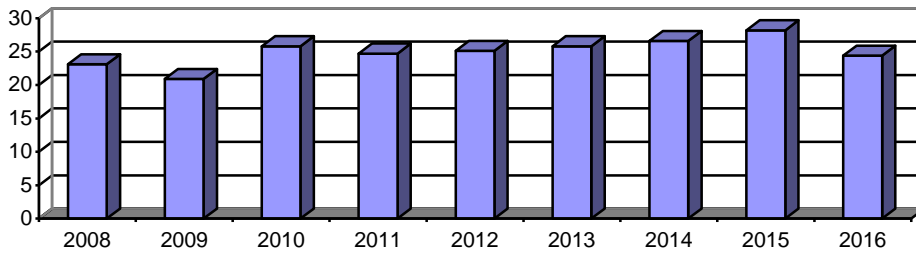

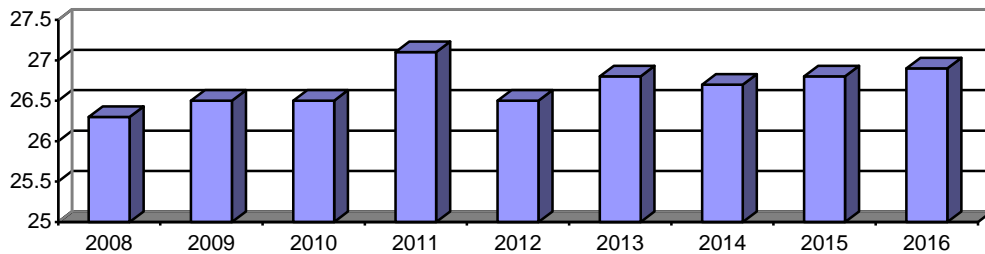

Average ACT Composite Score

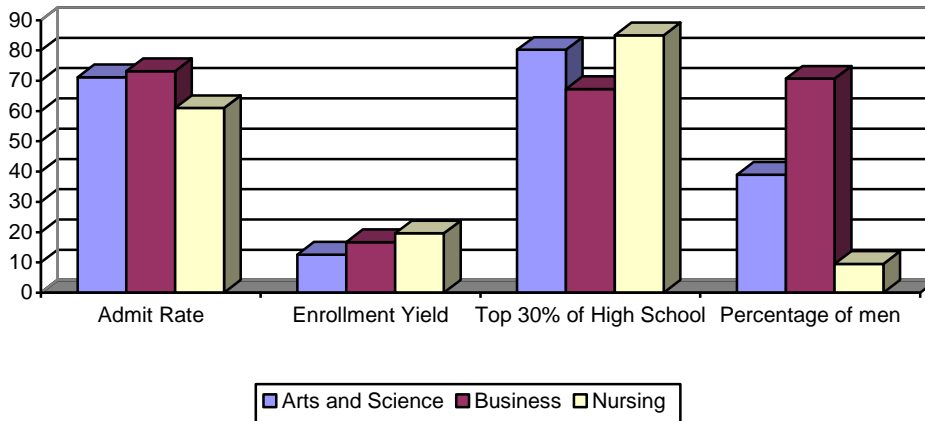
