Charles Jurgensmeier, S.J. *The Threepenny Opera* was Brecht's first and greatest commercial success, and it remains one of his best-loved and most-performed plays. Based on John Gay's 18th-century *Beggars Opera*, the play is set in Victorian England's Soho but satirizes the bourgeois society of the Weimar Republic through its wry love story of Polly Peachum and "Mack the Knife" Macheath.
