Young Male Participants Needed for Study

The Creighton Pediatric Infectious Disease department is looking for healthy, heterosexual young men ages 16 to 23 to enroll in a study for an investigational vaccine to reduce the incidence of HPV (Human Papillomavirus) genital infections. HPV anogenital wart infections have increased five-fold in the last 30 years. Treatment choices for genital warts may or may not be completely effective, and are likely to be painful. Transmission of HPV to a woman could eventually cause cervical cancer. This vaccine study will last for three years, and involves three vaccinations that occur during the first six months. Lakota Mentorship — Fall 2005 Invitation

If you are interested in participating in the second Lakota Immersion-Mentorship program, please contact Raymond Bucko, S.J., at bucko@creighton.edu. This program is open to administrators, faculty and staff and begins Aug. 30. The program includes working with Lakota high school students who are preparing for college, visiting historical and cultural sites on the Pine Ridge and Rosebud reservations, and a dialogue with Lakota students currently enrolled at Creighton as well as with other Lakota living on the reservations. Events are designed to allow each mentor to get to know her/his protégés and to begin the very complicated and lengthy process of completing the Gates Millennium Scholarship application. Goals of the Immersion-Mentorship Program are: to familiarize faculty and staff with the cultural context of many of Creighton's Native students; to provide an opportunity for inter-cultural dialogue and learning for participants; and to contribute to the strength of the Lakota community by mentoring some of their students in applying to college.
