**Artists and volunteers ranging from teens** to adults are needed to help paint a community mural on a large exterior wall on the northwest corner of 24th and Lake streets. The mural, reflecting some of the history of North Omaha, was designed and created by teens and young adults in a summer arts program sponsored by Heart of Care, a nonprofit community center at 2209 Lake St. The project is a cooperative effort with the City of Omaha, the Conestoga Community Homeowners Association, the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

Cornerstone Memorial and other community organizations. About three-fourths of the mural has been painted. The remainder generally will need to be completed by artists or volunteers with artistic skills to do detail work, shading and highlighting. Most of the painting will have to be done by using ladders or scaffolding. Because the project is in its final stage, workers with strong artistic abilities are preferred to facilitate finishing the mural in a timely fashion. However, less artistic volunteers may assist with other important tasks such as supervising students, setting up and breaking down equipment, mixing paint, providing snacks and beverages for workers, etc. The weekend work schedule for the mural is Saturday (Sept. 15) from 11 a.m.-3 p.m. and Sunday (Sept. 16) from 2 -6 p.m. The work crew meets first at Heart of Care, 2209 Lake St., and then proceeds to the mural site one block away.
