Professional Notes:

Dr. Timothy Cook, assistant professor of education, gave a guest lecture to the graduate students in the school administration program at the University of Notre Dame. Cook's book, "Architects of Catholic Culture: Designing & Building Catholic Culture in Catholic Schools," is being used as a text in Notre Dame's program.

Dr. Marilyn A. Kielniarz, chair of the Department of Fine and Performing Arts, received a copy of "The Liszt Companion" (Greenwood Press, ed. Ben Arnold). She is one of eight contributing international authors in this volume which updates and re-evaluates Liszt research over the past 30 years. Additionally, her six-part interactive classroom curriculum devoted to teaching

fundamentals of music theory has been accepted for publication and distribution by the American Guild of English Handbell Ringers.

Jinmei Yuan's (assistant professor of philosophy) paper, "Exploring the Logical Space in the Patterns of Classical Chinese Mathematical Art," won the award in the Third Charles Wei-hsun Fu Essay Contest in Field Being Philosophy and Non-substantialist Thought, 2002. The Charles Wei-hsun Fu Foundation is one of a very few organizations that gives awards to papers in the field of non-Western philosophy.

Dr. Greg Zacharias, associate professor of English and director of the Center for Henry James Studies, presented "The Significance of Informational Notes for 'The Complete Letters of Henry James'" at the International Conference of the Henry James Society in Paris on July 6. Zacharias was the co-organizer of the conference, which was supported in part by Creighton. Zacharias is executive director of the Henry James Society.
