SAFETY BELT TIPS: A safety belt should be worn over the shoulder (when

there is a shoulder strap), across the chest and low on the hips. The strong bones of the hips and shoulders can thus absorb the forces experienced in a crash. The belt should not be worn under the arm, behind the back, or across the stomach. The lap and shoulder belts should be snug to the body, but not so tight that you are uncomfortable. If either the lap or shoulder belt is too loose, the safety belt may not be able to hold the body in place and protect it from smashing into the interior of the vehicle. Safety belts are mandatory in Nebraska.
