Mary-Beth Muskin, assistant professor in the Education Department, recently published "Comprehensive competency based guidance curriculum for teen mothers" in the National Social Science Journal.

Dr. Jeffrey M. Smith, director of the counselor education program, recently completed a consultation project with the Douglas/Sarpy County Health Department, Chicano Awareness Center and the Urban League of Nebraska. Smith and four graduate students from the community counseling program trained 35 people to collect data for the Nebraska Minority Health Survey. Graduate student participants were: Emily Conboy, Stacey Duncan, Kristan Hering and Jamie Post. Smith also had a recent publication in the ERIC-CASS entitled "Physicians and counselors collaborate on men's avoidance of counseling services: A preliminary study." In July Smith presented a paper entitled "Subdue and dominion counterfeits: The principle causes of war" at the Humanities Conference at the University of the Aegean, Island of Rhodes, Greece.
