

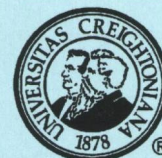

THE 7TH ANNUAL Thomas Timothy Smith Lecture will feature Fr. Edwin (Ned) H. Cassem, S.J., MD., Chief of Psychiatry at the Massachusetts General Hospital and associate professor of Psychiatry at Harvard University. Dr. Cassem will address, "Physician Assisted Suicide: Wake Up Call to America." The Lecture will take place Tuesday, Oct. 4, at Boys Town National Research Hospital Auditorium.
