Daniel Hilleman, associate professor of pharmacy practice, was installed as secretary of the Nebraska Society of Hospital Pharmacists. ■ Four College of Business Administration faculty members recently have received awards. **Dr. Stephen Hutchens**, chair of the management, marketing and systems department, was named outstanding educator of the year by the Greater Omaha American Marketing Association at its Pinnacle Awards Banquet on May 18. At the College's honors convocation on May 12, three faculty members received awards. **Dr. Marshall Schminke**, associate professor of management, received the Don Beck Excellence in Teaching Award, given for outstanding accomplishments in teaching, and the College of Business Service Award which recognizes outstanding achievements in the area of service. Dr. Schminke has worked closely as a strategic management consultant to the Omaha Police Department. **Dr. Ernie Goss**, professor of economics and holder of the MacAllister Chair in Regional Economics, was awarded the Excellence in Teaching Award. Dr. Goss manages the 11-state

Mid-American Survey of Business Conditions and the Mountain States Survey, and shares the results in newspapers and with regional economists. **Dr. Sal Valentino**, professor of economics management, was awarded the Fr. Neil Cahill Lifetime Award for Distinguished Service to the College of Business Administration. Fr. Cahill remains on the college faculty, now in his 51st year as a Jesuit. Dr. Valentino will retire at the end of the year, after serving on the faculty for 41 years. ■ **Dr. Tom Purcell**, associate professor of accounting, has been recognized by the Nebraska Society of Certified Public Accountants as the recipient of the 1995 Outstanding Accounting Educator Award. The 2,400 member Society recognized Dr. Purcell for his exemplary service to the Society, the practicing and academic profession of accounting, and the community.
