ST. IGNATIUS AWARD

St. Ignatius of Loyola urged followers of Jesus to practice continually the virtues proper to striving for the better way of serving God. The spirit of St. Ignatius is alive, not only in Jesuits, but in countless other men and women who live in service of others and seek the integration of faith through the promotion of justice. Each year, the Deglman Center for Ignatian Spirituality seeks out Creighton employees who attempt to live out the spirituality and mission of St. Ignatius and his followers. This recognition identifies individuals who are seen consciously to strive to live out Ignatian ideals through their work; their involvement with students; their commitments to family, friends, and church; their volunteer efforts and their personal spirituality. They should be, in the words of Pedro Arrupe, S.J., late Superior General of the Jesuits, "...people who cannot even conceive of love of God which does not include love for the least of their neighbors; people completely convinced that love of God which does not issue in justice for all people is a farce." (*Men for Others*, July, 1973.) The Deglman Center for Ignatian Spirituality invites you to nominate a faculty/administrator or staff member who is not a Jesuit, and who in your judgment has been touched by the spirit of Ignatius. One award will be given to a staff person and one to a faculty member or administrator. The awards will be given during the Mass of the Holy Spirit on September 15.
