CREIGHTON'S EFFORT in the Nebraska Legislature to secure funding for cancer research needs your support. Call or write your state senator this week asking him or her to vote in favor of LB 595, which proposes a two cent increase in the cigarette tax to be used for cancer research. It is proposed that half of this money will go to Creighton, with the other half going to the University of Nebraska Medical Center. This bill has the potential of generating up to \$1.3 million for Creighton.
