HEATING SYSTEM: The seasonal change from cooling to heating will be completed by the end of the month. Unlike residential systems which can be changed by flipping a switch, the campus process is much more involved. During this time, all chilled water is valved off, system coils and piping are drained, and the steam is turned on. Once into the heating mode, cooling can no longer be provided to buildings on the main campus. Facilities Management will do everything within the limitations of the system to assure a comfortable environment during this transition period.

REMINDER: If you or your organization are planning activities after hours or on weekends and require environmental control (heating or air conditioning), remember to call Facilities Management, x2780, to schedule these services. Most systems are turned off or operate at minimum climate control to reduce energy usage and save operating costs during these times.

ALL FACULTY AND staff members are reminded to report any campus emergency to the department of Public Safety immediately. Injuries, accidents, crimes, fires and other serious incidents in progress should be phoned to the Public Safety emergency line at x2911. Timely reporting expedites the Public Safety response and makes for successful resolution of the problem at hand.
