**HIGH SCHOOL Reciprocal Tuition Program:** Dependent children of full-time faculty, staff and administrators with three years of service with the University may apply for up to 25 percent remission of tuition at the following high schools during the 1993-94 academic year: Brownell-Talbot, Cathedral, Creighton Prep, Daniel J. Gross, Duchesne Academy, Fr. Flanagan, Mercy and Roncalli. The participating high schools must have

the names of the eligible students as soon as possible. Application forms are invalid if not completed and returned to the Business Office before June 25.
